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Additional Information - All Bursaries

- Bursaries can be combined with other sources of funding, including student teacher credits, provided that the amount of the bursary does not exceed the total costs incurred.
- Online courses do not qualify except for the Bursary for Teachers University Courses in French.
- All bursaries are taxable.

Additional Information - Bursary for teachers - Professional development in French

<u>Travel and Accommodation Subsidy</u>

Teachers who **must travel** more than 100km for professional development can receive up to \$500 in additional funding for travel, and up to \$300 for accommodation for each training program or conference, based on receipts. Mileage is calculated at \$0.52 per km. Accommodation subsidy will not exceed the Government of Canada's <u>city rate limits</u>. Intention to claim travel and accommodation expenses must be declared at the time of application. Daily travel expenses **are not** covered.

Disability and Childcare Subsidy

Additional funding of up to \$300 per year is available to accommodate applicants with a disability or functional limitation, or applicants requiring child care to attend the conference or training program. To request additional funding, please upload a letter describing your specific case when you apply online.

Deadlines

APPLY by February 28 for courses ending between June 1 of the previous year and May 31 of the current year. (e.g. Feb 28, 2016 is the deadline to apply for courses ending between June 1, 2015 and May 31, 2016). **Bursaries are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.**

SUBMIT Enrollment Confirmation and Reimbursement Forms by June 30 for courses ending between June 1 of the previous year and May 31 of the current year (e.g. you have until June 30, 2016 to submit your enrolment confirmation form for a course ending between June 1, 2015 and May 31, 2016).

If you are applying for a **Bursary for Teachers** please upload proof of teacher certification, such as:

- a copy of your certificate or letter of permission from the BC Teacher Regulation Branch
- the email you received confirming the renewal of your BC teaching certificate
- a screenshot or copy of your record from Find A Teacher

Next steps

1. Once the application has been reviewed, the Ministry will notify the candidate by email of the status of the application (ineligible, approved, or waiting list). Please note that we are unable to provide individual updates on the status of bursaries, as doing so significantly increases bursary processing times.

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- 2. If your bursary application is incomplete, or if any further information is required to process your application, we will contact you by email, and you will have an opportunity to supply the required information.
- To receive a bursary payment, candidates must submit the required form (see table below).
 These forms are available on our web page. A separate form for each semester must be submitted online.

STU	Pre-service French Teachers	No need to submit a form, as enrollment is confirmed with the post-secondary institution directly.		
TEACHERS	Teachers – Professional Development in French	Reimbursement Form – May be submitted once the conference, course or training program has ended. Receipts for conference registration fees and all eligible travel and accommodation expenses must be uploaded along with your completed Reimbursement Form. Instead of a completed Reimbursement Form, the Ministry will accept email confirmation that the candidate successfully completed the course or training program, and of the amount of tuition fees paid, from a representative of the organization that offered the program it, and the amount of tuition fees paid.		
	Teachers – University Courses in French	Reimbursement Form – May be submitted once the course or training program has been successfully completed. Graduate students at Simon Fraser University no longer need to submit a form, as enrollment and tuition fees are confirmed with SFU directly.		

- 4. Once this form has been approved, the Ministry will issue a payment for the semester or course in question. The applicant will be notified by email that a bursary payment is pending.
- 5. For bursaries that are paid out in two installments, candidates must submit the required form (see above) for the second semester.

Please notify us if your **name or address changes** after you submit your application for a French Programs bursary, but before you receive your final bursary payment.

Cheques are issued payable to the applicant and sent to the applicant's mailing address. Please allow six to eight weeks from receiving the email payment notification for your cheque to arrive.

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
